Junior State Cup Preliminary Games General Information

Preliminary games are self-scheduled by the participating teams. Please contact the coach or manager of your opposing team(s) to set up your preliminary game schedule and to obtain directions to the fields. The Home Team is always the first/top team listed. **All preliminary games must be played March 8 – May 4, 2025.** The only exception is that divisions with no Quarterfinal round (U10B&G 9v9 Division, U11G, Division 1) may play their preliminary games March 8 – May 16. Dates and times must be mutually agreed upon by both coaches. If both coaches cannot agree on game date(s), time(s), and location(s) for their preliminary games, MSYSA will schedule the game(s). If this occurs, the game(s) must be played as scheduled by MSYSA.

It is the responsibility of the Home Team (or Home Club) to schedule their preliminary games in GotSport. Date, time, and location (facility AND field number!) must be included. Scheduling in GotSport **MUST BE DONE BY 12:00 PM (NOON) ON FEBRUARY 19, 2025.** Failure to do so may result in forfeiture and subsequent fines.

There will be NO CHANGES to the schedule after the February 19 deadline (excluding weather-related changes).

Scheduling Games in GotSport
